

NATHANIEL SCHMIDT TO BE SPEAKER IN PHELPS

**Before Ontario County Woman
Suffrage Convention.**

Phelps, May 19.—The Ontario County Woman Suffrage Association will hold its sixth annual convention in Gibson Hall, Phelps, Monday, May 24th. There will be two sessions.

The morning session will be devoted to the transaction of association business, including report from the delegates to the state convention and reports of the county clubs. An essay on "Equal Suffrage" will be read by Miss Anna Devoll, who was awarded second prize in the contest recently held by the local club.

At 1:30 o'clock the delegates will meet for election of officers, after which Village President M. T. O'Brien and Mrs. Bussey, president of the local club, will deliver addresses of greeting, to which a response will be made by Mrs. C. A. Baldrige, of Geneva.

Fraternal delegates will then speak briefly in behalf of their organizations, as follows: "Foreign Missionary Society of the Presbyterian Church," Mrs. Wilcox; "Home and Foreign Missionary Society of the Methodist Church," Mrs. J. C. Gifford; "W. C. T. U.," Mrs. A. J. Wright; "Tuesday Club," Mrs. E. S. Warner; "The Grange," Mrs. F. A. Salisbury and George W. Salisbury. Miss A. F. Miller, president of the Geneva club, will respond.

There will then be a vocal solo by Mrs. Fox, of Clifton Springs; a report of the hearing at Albany by E. J. Cook, of Geneva, and an essay entitled "Why Women Vote," by Miss Grace Crampton, who was awarded first prize in the contest.

A feature of the meeting will be an address by Professor Nathaniel Schmidt of Cornell University, who will speak on "Government by the People."
