

ABLE SPEAKERS WILL BE HEARD

AT STATE WOMAN'S SUFFRAGE
CONVENTION.

ELABORATE PROGRAMME PREPARED

**Thirty-ninth Annual Meeting of New
York State Woman's Suffrage
Convention Will Be Held Four
Days in Geneva—Work to Be Done**

Geneva, Sept. 26.—The thirty-ninth annual convention of the New York State Women's Suffrage Association will be held in this city on October 15th to 18th, inclusive, in the First Baptist Church. It is just ten years ago since the state association met in Geneva. The organization of the Geneva Political Club was a result of that meeting, so the return of the State Association to Geneva marks the decennial of the local society.

For several weeks the Programme Committee has been at work, and its task has at last been completed. To-day Mrs. Charles H. Congdon, the chairman of the committee, announced complete arrangements for the meeting.

The convention will be opened with a meeting of the Executive Committee at 11 o'clock Tuesday morning in the Baptist Church. The convention proper will be called to order at 2 o'clock in the afternoon by the president, Mrs. Ella Hawley C. Crossett, of Warsaw. After the singing of the "Battle Hymn of the Republic" by the delegates, with Miss Nettie Howe at the organ, an opening prayer will be made by Rev. W. K. Towner, pastor of the First Baptist Church. The Credential Committee will then make its report. This will be followed by the appointment of Committees on Finance, Courtesies and Resolutions.

Mrs. Charlotte A. Baldrige, president of the Ontario County Political Club, will make an address of welcome. The response will be made by Mrs. Crossett in connection with her annual address to the association. Then will come these reports: Executive Committee, Mrs. Nicholas Shaw Fraser, Geneseo; corresponding secretary, Miss Alice Williams, Weedsport; auditors, Mrs. Eliza W. Osborne, Auburn; treasurer, Miss Annie E. Merritt, Hastings-on-Hudson; vice-president, Miss Harriett May Mills, Syracuse; Enrollment Committee, Mrs. Verna Heming Haley, Geneva, and school suffrage, Mrs. Jennie McKinney, Phelps.
