Canandaigua, April 28.—A convention of the Ontario County Woman Suffrage League will be held in the Historical Hall on Friday, May 14th, with two sessions, one beginning at 10:30 o'clock and the other at 2:30 and a mass meeting in the evening. The evening meeting will be held on the Court House steps beginning at 7:45 o'clock. Mrs. Carrie Chapman Catt, chairman of the State Campaign Committee, will be the principal speaker.

Convention of Ontario County Clubs in Canandaigua Friday.

Canandaigua, May 13.—The Ontario County Suffrage Convention will meet in the Historical Building in North Main street to-morrow and there will be a big mass meeting at the front steps of the Court House at 7:45 o'clock in the evening when Mrs. Carrie Chapman Catt, chairman of the Empire State Campaign Committee, will be the principal speaker.

The convention will be attended by delegates from each of the twelve suffrage clubs of this county. Those at Shortsville, Port Gibson, East Bloomfield, Naples and Clifton Springs, have been recently organized. The convention will convene at 10:30 o'clock and the afternoon session at 2:30 o'clock. Dinner is to be served at noon in the Historical Building.
